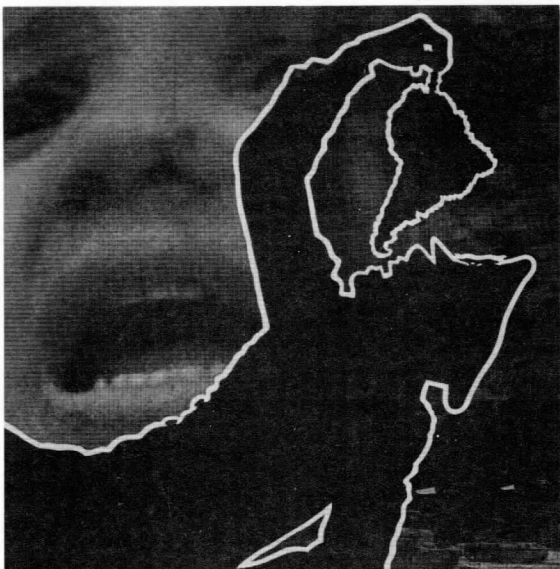

**PAUL STOPFORTH**

He was born in South Africa. He is currently a senior tutor in painting and drawing at the University of the Witwatersrand in Johannesburg. Mr. Stopforth is travelling to the USA to participate in a symposium, "Politics, Culture, and the Struggle for Liberation: The Situation in South Africa", at Massachusetts College of Art. He will be presenting his views on this subject at SMU during the opening.

**GUY BERGER**

was born and educated in South Africa. He has worked as a journalist and a lecturer in South Africa founding various "Grassroots" publications. He spent two years in detention for his activities as a journalist and is now exiled in London. Mr. Berger works with Alavision, an organization which seeks to disclose the true situation in South Africa. He will be bringing video footage which has never been seen in the USA, as the material has been gathered clandestinely since the media ban under the State of Emergency.

**FRANCES BECKER**

is a performance artist who grew up in South Africa, and who now lives and works in New York. Ms. Becker has a video piece in the exhibition and will be presenting a performance piece at the opening.
